PROGRAM: Major Ron Stucker of the Orange County Sheriff's Office in Florida spoke about the Casey Anthony Case. The case took three year's to complete. They had to investigate over 6,000 tips from all over the country. It took a tremendous amount of manpower and time to follow up on the tips. Casey Anthony repeatedly lied to law enforcement. The investigators used CSI techniques during this investigation. In this case, their investigators were the first to introduce the forensic science of chemical body decomposition in court. This technique was first studied at the University of Tennessee. Their office has made presentations to law enforcement agencies all over the country. They have also made presentations to the FBI Academy for training purposes.
